FAQ

(Frequently Asked Questions)

Q. Do I have to stop at all Ports in Wyoming?

A. You are required to stop anytime you see a regulatory sign, black letters on a white background, instructing you to stop or an officer has directed you to stop. PrePass vehicles which receive an in-cab green light may continue on the highway, providing they are **NOT** hauling livestock or do **NOT** have an oversize or overweight load.

Q. What do I do when I get to the Port of Entry?

A. Locations with weigh-in-motion scales, follow the overhead arrows directing which lane is to be used. If directed to the scale, stop on the scale; obey the lights for the scale or verbal instructions from the officer. When directed to the lane without the scale, park in the lot and bring in your permit book. You may be directed to proceed back to the highway by a signal, and may do so only if you do **NOT** require a permit. For locations without weigh-in-motion scales and overhead arrows, pull onto the scale and obey the lights for the scale or verbal instructions from the officer. When instructed or signaled to park and bring in paper work, park in the lot and bring in your permit book. When instructed or signaled to proceed, you may do so if you do **NOT** require a permit.

Q. Why was I chosen for an inspection?

A. All inspections are chosen at random.

Legal Sizes and Weights

Width: 8'6"

Height: 14'

Length:

60' on single unit, or semi-trailer in a Truck-Tractor, Semi-Trailer combination. 81' Semi-Trailer, Trailer combined length in a Truck Tractor, Semi-Trailer, Trailer combination (48' **maximum** semi-trailer and 40' **maximum** trailer). The heavier trailer must be the first unit behind the tractor if there is a weight difference exceeding 5,000 pounds.

85" Any combination of vehicles other than those listed above.

Single Axle = 20,000 lbs

Tandem Axle = 36,000 lbs

Triple Axle = 42,000 lbs

Each Wheel = 10,000 lbs

Steering Tires = 750 lbs per inch tire width

Other Tires = 600 lbs per inch tire width

Gross = Must comply with appropriate Gross Weight Table, Maximum 117,000 lbs.

PERMIT LIMITS:

Up to 18' wide, 17' high, 120' overall length and 160,000 lbs. gross weight may be approved by Port of Entry Officers. For loads over these limits, call the Overweight Loads Office. (307) 777-4376

All oversize or overweight loads must have permit or permission before entering the State or operating on Wyoming State highways.
