

# Oil Spill Response Plan & Report SPX Transformer Solutions, Inc.

**ATTENTION:** The load you are transporting contains oil. The maximum discharge is up to 6000 gallons per transformer. **If you find an oil leak you are responsible to stop the release and contain the spill.** If the leak is stopped and is contained, you may continue in transport.

## IF AN OIL LEAK OCCURS AND:

1. You cannot stop the release and contain the spill, **OR**
2. The oil has been leaked onto surface water or into a ditch that causes a film or "sheen" upon the surface of the water, **OR**
3. More than a gallon of oil is spilled on the bare ground

Step 2:	<b>Call Environmental Products &amp; Services of Vermont, Inc.</b>  Within 2.5 hours, this emergency spill service will arrive on-site to begin to clean-up, contain, mitigate, transport and dispose of released materials according to state and federal regulations. Step 3:	<b>Call The National Response Center</b> immediately if an oil spill occurs <b>and</b> the oil discharges into surface water or greater than a gallon has spilled on the bare ground.  National Response Center 1-800-424-8802 or 1-202-267-2675
